All Triple Rated shows require current memberships in USEF, USEF, and CDS. Each membership enables the competitor, horse owner, trainer, and the horse to be eligible for year-end awards and qualifications for Final annual competitions.

CDS – California Dressage Society: <https://www.california-dressage.org>

- Go to the website and make sure your membership is updated. Payment is due each year, expiring on the last day of the year.
- Benefits are CDS awards and recognitions, plus qualifications for the Annual Championship show held each year in September.
- **NonMember fees for rider and owner in a CDS only show are \$25 each.**

USEF – US Equestrian Federation: <https://www.usef.org>

- Go to the website and make sure your membership is updated. Payment is due each year, expiring on the last day of November each year.
- In addition, it is good to obtain the USEF Lifetime Horse Identification (HID) number for many other types of competitions in which you will show your horse.
- Benefits are USEF awards and recognitions.
- **NonMember fees for rider and owner in a triple rated show are \$45 each.**

USDF – US Dressage Federation: <https://www.usdf.org>

- Go to the website and make sure your membership is updated. Payment is due each year, expiring on the last day of November each year.
- In addition, you will need the USDF Lifetime Horse Identification (HID) number, required for dressage show competitions. Although you can pay annually or the \$35 HID fee to enter the show, the better expense is to obtain the lifetime ID number.
- Benefits are the many USDF awards and recognitions.
- **NonMember fees for rider and owner in a triple rated show are \$35 each. Also \$35 for the Horse ID.**

COVID-19 Risk Mitigation Process for SJC Summer Series Shows I, II, III

Mandatory Requirements for Participants - *Any changing Updates will be emailed*

General

All USEF-licensed competitions must be held and comply with all applicable federal, state and local regulations, requirements and orders as well as WHO recommendations and CDC guidelines as they relate to mass gatherings and sporting events. ***Participants are required to comply with these and any additional Competition Organizer requirements at all times while present on competition grounds. Failure to do so may result in expulsion from the grounds.***

These requirements are in effect immediately and until further notice, however, they are subject to revisions as the COVID-19 virus environment changes.

Waiver/Release & Indemnity Agreement

Provide emergency contact information and execute an updated Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement required by USEF, as a condition of participation. Please ensure use of the updated form provided by competition organizer.

Access

- Participants are required to self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to entering the competition grounds. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4° F or higher may not enter the facility.
- Anyone who:
 - exhibits COVID-19 symptoms,
 - has tested positive for COVID-19 within last two weeks, or
 - has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last two weeks cannot enter the competition grounds.
 - *Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties are exempted from this restriction.
 - Refer to Appendix A for CDC guidelines for self-isolation/quarantine directives in the event a person has a fever or exhibits other symptoms of COVID-19.
- Participants are required to wear a facemask or face covering when in a public setting where there is a possibility of being within six feet of other individuals, and when not mounted on a horse.***
 - **A participant may choose to wear a facemask or face covering when mounted on a horse and cannot be disqualified or penalized for doing so while competing.

Social Distancing/Participation Protocols

- Comply with social distancing requirements at all times while on the competition grounds.
 - No group congregating in barn area or near the arenas.
- Wash hands often and adhere to other sanitization practices throughout the day.

Non Contact Temperature gauge and hand sanitizer will be available at the show office.

RULES AND SHOW INFORMATION

All SJC-CDS shows and every class offered herein are covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

ENTRY PROCEDURE: Please submit completed and signed entry form and include copies of your membership/horse registration cards, proof of Freestyle score eligibility (if entered in a freestyle) along with all fees. All entries must be made on official entry blanks and filled out completely as to classes, exhibitors names, addresses, phone numbers, association numbers, and signatures. Parents or guardians must sign the official entry blank of a minor before a number will be released. **Entries that are missing fees, signatures, copies of membership cards or any information will be assessed a fee of \$35.00 the day of the show. NO EXCEPTIONS!** Entries will be accepted on a first come-first serve basis until classes are filled and classes MAY fill prior to the closing date. Competitors are encouraged to send entries in early.

MEMBERSHIP: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENTS:

AMATEURS, JUNIORS & YOUNG RIDERS: Amateurs are defined by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book. All riders entering the Amateur classes must possess or have applied for an USEF Amateur Card prior to riding in the class. All riders in Amateur Divisions must present a USEF Amateur Card when picking up their number or they will not be allowed to show in the Amateur Division. Cards may be applied for at the show office. Jr/ YR rider classes are offered to anyone 21 and under (may compete until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 21). **2022 entries require two signed signature pages per entry.**

CONDITION OF ENTRY: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Show Management, but the Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show; its Directors and Employees, and SJC CDS Chapter; its Directors and Employees, harmless for any loss or accident, to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from accident, sickness, fire or otherwise.

CLOSING OF ENTRIES: All entries must be received on or before the closing date. Entries may be submitted online or mailed by 5pm on day of closing. Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until classes are filled. Any entry received after the closing date will be accepted only if schedule permits and will be assessed a late fee of \$40.00.

MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, with their decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to: refuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claim for damages, cancel or combine any classes, reschedule classes and rotate judges in order to facilitate the time schedule.

JUDGES: Show management reserves the right to add additional judges, if entries warrant, or to substitute the judge designated in the Show Premium should a situation arise where they are unable to fulfill their judging obligations.

REFUNDS: Refunds are only issued prior to the closing date. After entries close there are NO REFUNDS unless your ride time can be filled by a rider on a wait list for that specific class. Any refunds that meet this criteria will be returned less the \$50.00 office fee.

CANCELLATION: In the event of inclement weather, natural or other disasters prior to the show, it is the competitor's responsibility to contact Show Management as to the status of the show. If the show is canceled for any reason, a \$45.00 fee will be retained from each entry.

SCRATCHES: Scratches before the closing date may be made for any reason and all fees will be refunded except the Mandatory Office Fee of \$50.00. After the Closing Date there are no refunds for any reasons. Scratches after entries close should be made in writing to Sandy Harper at airpegasus.2008@gmail.com

SAFESPORT: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. RULES AND SHOW INFORMATION

RIDE TIMES: Times will be e-mailed, posted on FoxVillage, and posted on the San Juan Chapter website prior to the show at www.sjc-cds.org

PROOF OF IMMUNIZATION: Competitors must provide proof of immunization of their horses for Flu / Rhino within the last 6 months to prevent spread of EHV1 on the showgrounds. Most recent inoculation will need to be a minimum of **7 days** before the show date.

SHOW OFFICE: ALL competitors must check-in promptly upon arrival on the show grounds. The show office is located next to the covered arena and will be open approximately 1 hour before start of show and until approximately 30 minutes after the last ride of the day. Show Management can be reached at 949-466-4916 on day of show.

BRIDLE NUMBERS: Upon check-in, the competitor will receive their bridle number which must be on the halter or bridle of their horse at all times, when horse is being hand walked, lunged, ridden or tied to trailer.

WARM UP: All riders MUST warm up in the official warm up arena where a Ring Steward is stationed. This applies to those riders and horses who normally board at Sycamore Trails Stables that are entered in the show. Only horses entered in the show will be allowed in the warm up areas. No one on foot is allowed in the warm up arena. Every horse in the warm up must have checked in with the show office and be wearing a competition number.

LUNGING: Lunging is allowed in designated areas only. There is no lunging allowed in the warm up arenas.

HELMETS: (Effective April 1, 2013) From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801.

TESTS: Current USDF, USEF and FEI tests will be used.

ARENAS: 20m x 60m competition arenas. All lunging, warm up, and competition arenas are sand composite footing.

SCORED TESTS: Scored tests will be distributed to the rider or their authorized representatives only. Scored tests will be available after all results have been finalized.

RIBBONS & AWARDS: In each class, ribbons will be awarded to 1st through 5th place. Prizes will be awarded in classes with three or more riders.

STABLING: **No Stabling is available on the show grounds. Sycamore now only allows for Trailer Ins. DO NOT CONTACT** the Sycamore office.

TRAILER-IN FEE: For those trailering in, there will be a \$20 fee per horse per day to be paid with the entry form. Please note on your entry the size of your trailer and which horses you will be bringing in. Please contact Sandy Harper at 949-466-4916 or via email at airpegasus.2008@gmail.com.

SHARPS CONTAINER / MEDICAL WASTE: The sharps container will be located in the show office.

STALLIONS: Please note that Sycamore Trails **does not permit Stallions** on the facility grounds at any time.

DOGS: We love dogs too, but we prefer they are left at home. If you must bring a dog, it MUST be on a leash at ALL times.

TRAILERS & PARKING: Signage directing trailers will be placed at the entrance to Sycamore Trails Stables on the day of the show. Trucks and trailer may only park in designated parking areas. The speed limit throughout the stables is 5mph. All cars and trucks not attached to trailers will be required to park in the designated parking lot.

VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

ONE HORSE PER ENTRY FORM. ADDITIONAL RIDERS ON A HORSE MUST HAVE SEPARATE ENTRIES. SIGNATURES MANDATORY FOR RIDER, OWNER AND TRAINER EVEN IF SAME INDIVIDUAL.

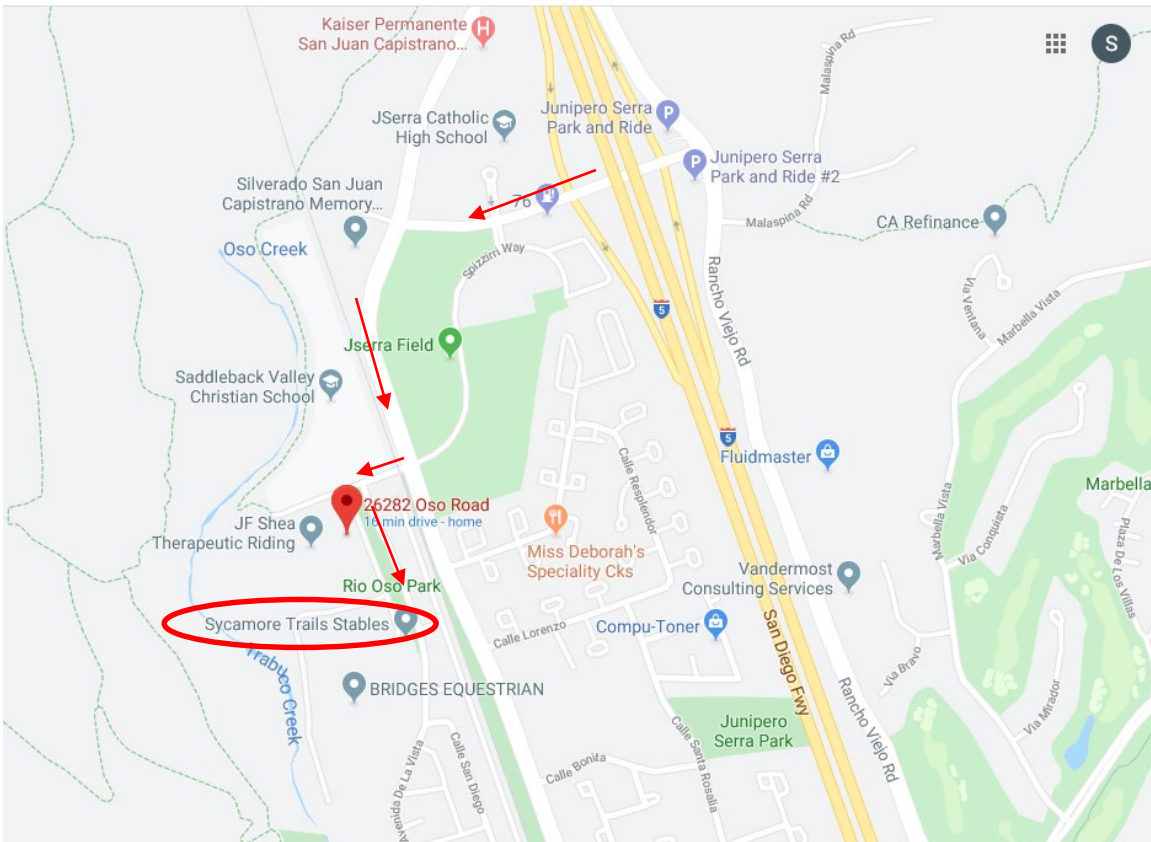

2022 YEAR END AWARDS

Be a part of the fun and qualify for the SJC-CDS 2021 Year End Awards! Year End Champions at each level receive an embroidered jacket, champion ribbon, and stall plaque. Reserve champions receive a ribbon and an embroidered apparel item.

To be eligible for any SJC-CDS Year End Awards, the rider must comply with the following:

- Be an active San Jan Capistrano Chapter CDS Member in good standing at the time scores are earned OR pay a nominating fee of \$35 dollars to the SJC-CDS Chapter. The fee must be paid on or before August 31st, 2022.
- For 2022, you must participate in a minimum of 2 SJC-CDS shows during the current 2022 show series.
- For Training through 4th Levels, you need a minimum of 3 scores from 3 different SJC-CDS Shows. If more than 3 scores are earned, the lowest scores are dropped with a maximum of up to 6 scores used to obtain an average.
- For FEI Tests PSG through GP, you need a minimum of 2 scores from 2 different SJC-CDS Shows. If more than 2 scores are earned, the lowest scores are dropped with a maximum of up to 3 scores used to obtain an average.
- Champion and Reserve Champions will be named at each level, Training Level to Grand Prix, for each division - Open, AA, and Jr/YR.
- The North Night Perpetual Trophy is awarded yearly to the Highest Scoring Mare that is ridden by an SJC-CDS Chapter Member.
- SJC-CDS Trainer of the Year is awarded yearly to the trainer with the most Year End Award winners (10 points for champion, 5 points for reserve).
- Year End Award winners are notified in September and all awards are presented at the SJC-CDS Annual Awards Dinner held each November.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by

Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.

or

- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

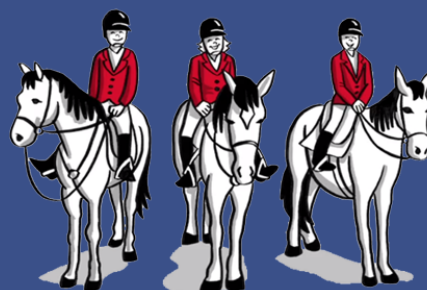
- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

(USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2022 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

Dressage (training or schooling) is an equitation term that means the gradual harmonious development of the horse's physical and mental condition with the aim to achieve the improvement of his natural gaits and perfect understanding with his rider.
